Premier Cooperative Scholarship

Again this year Premier Cooperative is proud to be sponsoring scholarships for graduating high school seniors planning to pursue an Ag Short Course or any other 2+ year accredited degree program after high school. In order to qualify for one of the 30 potential scholarships (up to \$500 each) to be awarded at the January 2022 annual meeting.
