INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM PHILOSOPHY

The Lancaster Community School District is organized and operated to serve the needs of the children and youth of this school community. The District's primary goals are to:

1. Teach the fundamental skills and concepts in the broad areas of learning such as those in English, mathematics, science, social science, business, the fine arts, vocational and physical training, and to encourage all persons to develop these skills and concepts to the optimum;
2. Develop wholesome ideals and attitudes in accord with the American way of life in a democratic society; and
3. Prepare its citizens to take a worthwhile place in the economic, social, civil and moral life of the community, state and nation.

A primary responsibility of the school is to provide opportunities for all students to acquire a general education. While vocational skills may be taught at the high school level, students are encouraged to seek additional training beyond high school to prepare them for employment in a chosen field.
