ACP/School Counseling Services

Our school counselors play a pivotal role in supporting students' academic and career planning by providing guidance in navigating educational pathways and exploring potential career options. They collaborate with students to assess their interests, strengths, and goals, guiding them toward making informed decisions about their academic journey. In addition to academic planning, counselors also focus on social and emotional learning, fostering a supportive environment where students can develop crucial interpersonal skills, emotional intelligence, and resilience. Moreover, they actively engage in employability skill development, helping students acquire the necessary skills and knowledge for success in the workforce. As students approach their senior year, counselors play a crucial role in facilitating individual conferences to discuss post-graduation plans, address any concerns, and ensure students are well-prepared for the transition into higher education or the workforce. These personalized sessions serve as a valuable opportunity to tailor guidance to each student's unique needs, ultimately empowering them to embark on a successful and fulfilling future.

Whole School Support

- Students participate in regular career conversations to discuss their career interests, academic goals, and postsecondary plans with an adult.
- Teachers in all subject areas help students in their classes understand how the content they are learning connects with various careers and career readiness skills.
- Course Registration Night offered in the spring semester for all middle school students and rising freshmen and their parents to collaborate on providing an ideal schedule for students based on ACP goals.
