Targeted or District-Wide

May be used for short or long-term needs as determined Teachers and schools to quickly identify students by positive COVID-19 cases

Schedule

School will be in session Monday - Friday Staff on campus, students at home

Devices and Access

Students use district device, home Internet access becomes vital for all students

Traditional grading (Middle/High School: A-F, Elementary: Standards-based grading)

INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL: BLENDED LEARNING

Grades 7-12

May be used to reduce the number of students in larger secondary schools. Pre-kindergarten through fifth grade will continue traditional classroom learning

Note: Fourth and fifth grade may utilize the blended learning model due to large class sizes

Schedule

Monday, Tuesday: Cohort A attends class; Virtual Learning for Cohort B Wednesday, Thursday: Cohort B attends class, Virtual Learning for Cohort A Fridays will be alternated

Early Identification

Teachers and schools to quickly identify students struggling to engage

Grading

Traditional grading (Secondary A-F, Elementary 1-5)

Devices and Access

Students use district device, home Internet access becomes vital for all students

INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL: TRADITIONAL CLASSROOM LEARNING

Return to the classroom

Students and staff practice operational safety procedures to reduce the spread of COVID-19

Staffing

May be reassigned to support distancing and safety procedures, enabling students to return to the classroom

Schedules

Daily schedule modification (ex. lunch, recess) as necessary with start and end of day bell times remaining the same

Social Emotional

SEL Foundation for reboarding students and staff

Alternatives

Students and families who are not comfortable will be provided an online/virtual option

INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL: SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL HEALTH

Reboarding

Focus on social and emotional health during the first week back in school for students and staff, focusing on inclusion and anxiety reduction

Climate and Culture

Work to introduce students to new look of school and classrooms before school starts, creating welcoming environments for learning

Universal Instruction

Lean on existing curricular components of Second Step, Zones of Regulation, and Advisory Periods

OPERATIONS: PHYSICAL SPACES

Implementation of guidelines based on Center for Disease Control and Grant County Health Department guidance

Physical Barriers

Plexiglass barriers will be installed in public spaces

Floor Adhesives

Separation stickers (6') in high-traffic areas (ex: hallways, main entrances) Flow of traffic

Safety Signage

Hand Hygiene Social Distancing Symptoms

Drinking Water

Bottle filling only

Sanitation Stations

Increased placement and encouraged usage

Locker Usage

Limited locker usage Use of backpacks is encouraged

Creating Space for Social Distancing

Removal of furniture Reconfiguration or movement of work spaces Reconfiguration or movement of teaching spaces

Isolation Room

Isolation space will be identified in each school building, in addition to sick room

OPERATIONS: HEALTHY ENVIRONMENTS

Ventilation

Increased filtration inspections

Cleaning and Disinfecting

Increased daily and weekly protocols

Shared Objects

Individual supplies

Communal Spaces

Creation of additional spaces (more lunch tables)

Hand Hygiene

Best practices will be taught and reinforced

Modified Building Layouts

Adjusted student pedestrian patterns

OPERATIONS: DAY-TO-DAY

Visitors

Limit non-essential visitors and visits

Cohorts

Move elementary grade levels as static groups Limit interaction outside of classroom environment

Entrances and Exits

Regulate access and directional flow

Face Coverings

Consideration given to CDC, DPI and Grant County Health Department guidance

Field Trips and Gatherings

Limit and monitor conditions before final approval for trips and large school events

COVID-19 Point of Contact

Contact school (Winskill Elementary, Middle School, High School) office personnel

OPERATIONS: TRANSPORTATION

Student Capacity

One student per seat on the bus (students from the same household may sit together) Sit at a window seat to provide six feet of separation

Face Coverings

Student face coverings will not be required, but are encouraged

Health and Safety

Buses will be disinfected following each route with special attention to high-touch areas

Self-Transport

Parents and/or students planning to self-transport are encouraged to contact director of transportation to increase accuracy of routes and staffing requirements

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

WIAA Guidance

Rely on and implement guidance from WIAA to safely hold athletic practices, competitions and events

Clubs and Activities

Assuming school is able to resume in a traditional classroom learning environment, clubs and activities will take place with social distancing and safety measures in place

Moving Between Models

Activities and events may be postponed or adjusted to meet guidelines and/or current conditions in schools or the community
